Abstract description (EN):

The Carlow Men's Health Project (CMHP) aims to build social capital among vulnerable men in Carlow Town and County

in the Republic of Ireland in order to support them to empower themselves and to have control over their own health and lives. The objectives of the CMHP include: •partnership work to raise awareness among existing community service providers of the needs of vulnerable men, •training existing service providers to support them to engage and interact with men, •conducting a needs analysis among vulnerable men to develop aworking plan, •implementing the working plan, •access funding to support the

implementation of the plan, independently evaluate the whole project as well as specific short programmes delivered as part of the project.CMHP work plan's strategic areas include; awareness raising, communications and public relations, delivery of short programmes, group maintenance including review, up-skilling and training, and evaluation and dissemination. To date, CMHP have run a number of activities to support men which have included: Healthy Dads Day, Health Awareness Raising Days,

Health Checks & Health Needs Assessment, Health & Physical Activity programmes, a Radio broadcast, a six-week Men's Health Series in the Carlow Nationalist and the production of the Men's Health Booklet. 2011 will also see the first Men's Shed in County Carlow. In engaging men the project has found that opportunistic health checks are a useful way to engage men at risk who don't access traditional services.
