Background



- Medical and Nursing Education Currricula focused only science and medicine
- Students pressured by demanding studies
- No time and opportunities to be exposed in philosophy, humanities and arts
- Medicine graduates have to deal with complex human feelings and situations besides complex medical problems
- Sex and gender issues addressed only in medical and not socio-economic context
- Majority of physicians do not feel concerned about personal and family issues of their patients

Central Issues



- 1. Women seeking medical advice need to understand not only their treatment options but also how a treatment affects their professional and family life
- 2. Importance of health literacy for all
- 3. Physicians should be trained in compassionate care to face complex health and life issues as in serious chronic diseases.

- Introduce health literacy and healthy living in all education levels
- 2. Introduce humanities and arts in medical education
- Introduce compassionate care and communication skills in medical internship programs




