What do we need to address

- Absence of social model of care resulting in women 'not having ownership of their pregnancies'
- Societal gender inequity 'women have no voice' or not given information
- A major paradigm shift is required; prevention v. cure, understanding person-centred continuum of care that brings improved outcomes (SDGs)
 - re-thinking the utilisation of resources
- Too much too soon, too little too late
 - Increase in CS, other interventions
 - Access to antenatal care
 - Lack of evidence-based care
- Midwifery education, training and continuing professional development

- Sharing statistics and data
 - Who are the stakeholders?
 - What is relevant data; access to maternity care, user experience, clinical data
